Since 1994, the National Lottery has raised more than £47 billion for good causes. Of this, The National Lottery Heritage Fund has distributed over £8.6bn to more than 49,000 heritage projects across the UK.

Each year, The National Lottery Awards celebrate the inspirational people and projects who do extraordinary things with the help of that National Lottery funding.
